

The XV Conference "Romanian Day of Liberal Professions"

The 2nd of November 2022, the Romanian Union of Liberal Professions (UPLR) organized, in partnership with the Commission for budget, finance, and banks, of the Country's Parliament, a conference aiming to discuss "Capital versus responsibility and independence in the field of liberal professions".

The event, which was held in the iconic Palace of the People, was a part of the meetings organized in the context of the annual Conference "Romanian Day of Liberal

Professions".

Its purpose was to analyze the impact of the participation of financial investors on the activities of liberal professions from the perspective of their professions themselves, as well as on the quality of the services provided by the liberal professionals to their clients, patients, and consumers.

The debate was attended by MPs, senators, representatives of ministries that collaborate with the liberal professions, of universities, as well as of associations of liberal professions.

Mr. Bogdan-Iulian Huţucă, President of the Commission for budget, finance, and banks of the Romanian Parliament, and Mr. Bogdan-Marius Chiriţoiu, President of the Competition Council, were also present.

Most of those who took the floor concluded that the free movement of capital must not affect the quality of the services provided by the liberal professionals in the public interest.

Conf. univ. Dr. Gheorghe Ialomițianu, President of the Romanian Union of Liberal Professions (UPLR), emphasized the fact that independence and responsibility are fundamental values that belong to the essence of the liberal professions. They define the activities performed by their members, and thus they must not be limited in any way.
